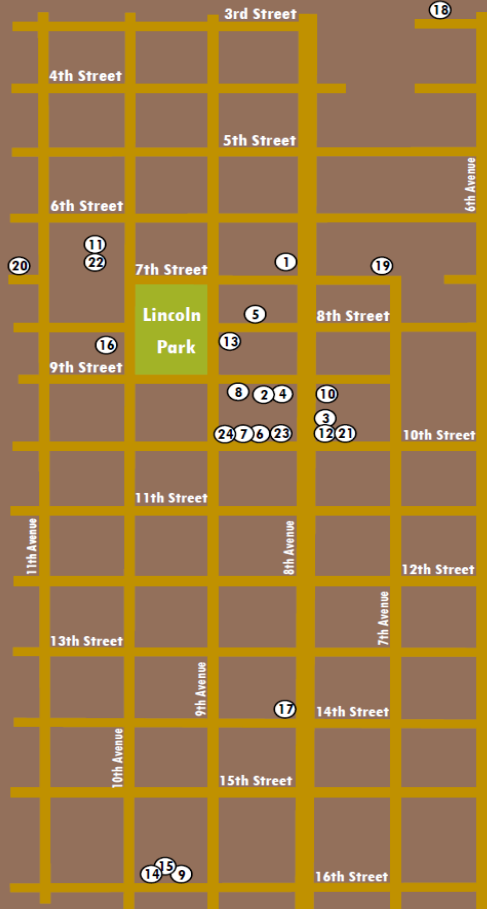

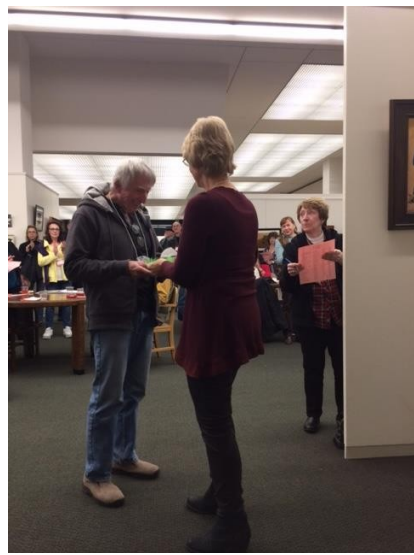

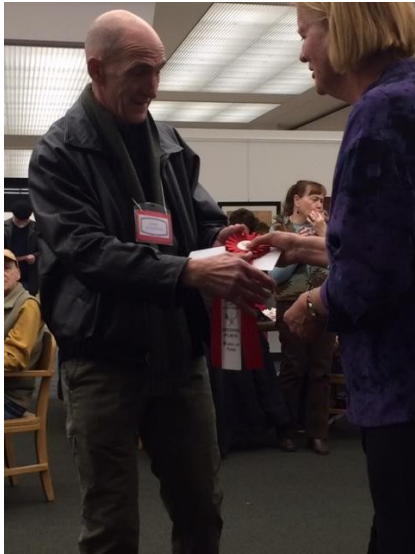

Pat Saunders-White's distinctive style, combination of subject matter, bold composition, and electric color, is instantly recognizable. Her 'Colorful Attitudes' series captures the look and personality of her subjects. The 'Dreamtime Pictograph' series is a contemporary vision of native Australian work. 'Frogs and Friends' offers a whimsical look at amphibians and crawly things.

Pat states: "Paintings should have some sort of story appeal. The viewer might ask, "What's going on here?" It could be a simple singular idea or two shapes simply touching or leaning against each other. The idea is to create a visual appeal through color that might cause tension and or to visually communicate an idea with form, shape, color, mood and brush marks."

"I want the viewer to believe they are eavesdropping on a painting that is having a good time chatting. While in the act of painting, I am constantly communicating with the developing image. Sometimes arguing, but always coming to a compromise at the end."

"For me, even a simple, single idea is enough to get me started. Then my heart, mind and passion take over. My paintings today express my feelings towards the subject matter. Each time I start a new piece of work I go at it like my best painting hasn't happened yet..."
